What is WAPAC?

The Wisconsin Association of Professional Agricultural Consultants (WAPAC) was formed in 1987 to provide a unified voice for professionals advising farmers in Wisconsin.

WAPAC's diverse membership includes crop consultants, animal nutritionists, farm managers, educators and a wide array of farm service industry advisors, giving the Association many sources of experience from which to draw for problem solving. WAPAC's annual meeting and its New Horizons Seminar provide forums for the exchange of ideas of a technical nature as well as the more practical matters of operating a consulting business. The Association exists to foster professionalism and a high level of ethics within its membership. Members subscribe to a code of ethics based on the ARCPACS model which is designed to maintain integrity and the reputation of agricultural professionals. WAPAC's goal is to promote agricultural consulting as a profession and to elevate the public's perception of the role of consultants in agriculture.

Benefits of WAPAC Membership

WAPAC provides a unified voice in expressing concerns and philosophy of agricultural consulting in Wisconsin. WAPAC promotes professionalism and credibility for consultants. All members receive the quarterly WAPAC newsletter, *New Horizons*, which is a vehicle for communication among consultants. WAPAC's Annual Meeting and New Horizons Seminar provide opportunities for advanced training and exchange of ideas. WAPAC provides a network for referral of members. WAPAC provides a directory of members which is available to the public.

Membership Classifications

Voting Members devote a majority of their time to providing professional agricultural consulting services or technical service support to the public and meet the requirements of training and experience as stated in the WAPAC Bylaws and interpreted by the Membership & Recruitment Committee. Applicants for voting membership must meet one of these five requirements:

- High school diploma and 10 years experience.
- Associate degree and 7.5 years experience.
- BS degree and 5 years experience.
- MS degree and 3 years experience.
- PhD degree and 1 year experience.

Categories of voting membership are:

1. Professional Agricultural Consultant - is certified by and in good standing with a professional organization possessing a certification program and code of ethics in the field of the person's expertise. (In cases where no certifying organization exists for a particular discipline, professional agricultural status will be determined on a case by case basis by the Membership & Recruitment Committee.) Professional agricultural consultants devote a majority of their time to providing professional agricultural consulting services or technical service support rather than to sales.

2. Academic Member - works as an instructor, researcher, extension service member or administrator at a qualified educational institution and is certified and in good standing with a professional organization possessing a certification program and code of ethics in the field of the person's expertise.

Professional Agricultural Consultants and Academic members may request retired status when they no longer engage in paid professional activities as a primary source of income. Voting privileges are maintained.

Non-Voting Members do not meet the requirements of voting membership but wish to participate in all WAPAC events and receive all WAPAC mailings.

The categories of non-voting membership are:

- 1. Associate Member** - does not meet the requirements of voting membership and/or the majority of his/her income is derived from selling products / applications. (Associate members may request retired status when they no longer engage in the paid activities of Associate members as a primary source of income.)
- 2. Provisional Member** - possesses all qualifications required of voting members but lacks either education, certification or experience requirements of the discipline. Provisional members are working toward becoming voting members.
- 3. Sustaining Member** - an individual, corporation or organization wishing to support WAPAC.
- 4. Student Member** - enrolled in an accredited college or university. Students may remain in this classification for one year following graduation.

Once submitted, your membership application form is reviewed by the WAPAC Membership & Recruitment Committee. Upon approval of your application by the committee, you will be sent a written statement of acceptance.

CODE OF ETHICS

ARTICLE I. GENERAL PRINCIPLES

1. The privilege of professional practice imposes obligations of morality and responsibility as well as professional knowledge.
2. Each member agrees to be guided by the highest standards of ethics, personal honor, and professional conduct.

ARTICLE II. RELATION OF PROFESSIONAL TO THE PUBLIC

1. A member shall avoid and discourage sensational, exaggerated, and/or unwarranted statements that might induce participation in unsound enterprises.
2. A member shall not knowingly permit the publication of his reports or other documents for any unsound or illegitimate undertaking.
3. A member shall not give professional opinion or make a recommendation without being as thoroughly informed as might reasonably be expected considering the purpose for which the opinion or recommendation is desired; and the degree of completeness of information upon which it is based should be made clear.
4. A member may publish dignified business, professional, or announcement cards, but shall not advertise his work or accomplishments in a self-laudatory, exaggerated, or unduly conspicuous manner.

5. A member shall not issue a false statement or false information even though directed to do so by employer or client.

ARTICLE III. RELATION OF PROFESSIONAL TO EMPLOYER AND CLIENT

1. A member shall protect, to the fullest extent possible, the interest of his employer or client insofar as such interest is consistent with the law and his professional obligations and ethics.
2. A member who finds that his obligations to his employer or client conflict with his professional obligations or ethics should have such objectionable conditions corrected or resign.
3. A member shall not use, directly or indirectly, any employer's or client's information in any way which would violate the confidence of the employer or client.
4. A member retained by one client shall not accept without client's written consent, an engagement by another if the interests of the two are in any manner conflicting.
5. A member who has made an investigation for any employer or client shall not seek to profit economically from the information gained, unless written permission to do so is granted, or until it is clear that there can no longer be a conflict of interest with the original employer or client.
6. A member shall not divulge information given him in confidence.
7. A member shall engage, or advise his employer or client to engage, and cooperate with, other experts and specialists.
8. A member shall not accept a concealed fee for referring a client or employer to a specialist or for recommending professional service other than his own.

ARTICLE IV. RELATION OF PROFESSIONALS TO EACH OTHER

1. A member shall not falsely or maliciously attempt to injure the reputation of another.
2. A member shall freely give credit for work done by others to whom the credit is due and shall refrain from plagiarism in oral and written communications, and not knowingly accept credit rightfully due another person.
3. A member shall not use the advantages of salaried employment to compete unfairly with another member of his profession.
4. A member shall endeavor to cooperate with others in the profession and encourage the ethical dissemination of technical knowledge.
5. A member having knowledge of unethical practices of another member shall avoid association with that member in professional work.

ARTICLE V. DUTY TO THE PROFESSION

1. A member shall aid in exclusion from certification those who lack moral character, who have not followed this Code of Ethics, or who do not have the required education and experience.
2. A member shall uphold this Code of Ethics by precept and example and encourage, by counsel and advice, other members to do the same.
3. A member having positive knowledge of deviation from this Code by another member shall bring such deviation to the attention of the Executive Council.
